

Fellowship Training Program

Facilitates in-depth training in the developed world

- Provides nephrology training to physicians from emerging countries
- Key goal: improve the standards, knowledge and care in the Fellows' home countries upon their return
- Knowledge is acquired in basic and clinical nephrology, dialysis transplantation, and epidemiology
- Partnerships with other organisations & societies


More than 500 young nephrologists from 80 countries have been trained as ISN Fellows since 1985

Sister Renal Center Program

Builds capacity through local centers of excellence

- Ultimate goal: the creation of local 'centers of excellence' to support and enhance nephrology within their geographical outreach
- An Emerging Centre is linked to a Supporting Centre and is guided through the program's 3 support levels
- The Sister Pair is supported through educational benefits and follow up
- New SRC Trio allows graduating pairs to develop a combined supporting role for a new emerging center within the same region



Research and Prevention Program

Provides a global strategy for the prevention and regression of progressive renal diseases

- Establishes intervention and screening programs in emerging countries to:
 - Involve the active participation of local nephrologists and health authorities
 - Increase the overall level of care
- Runs the KHDC Program
 - Detection and Management of Chronic Kidney disease,
 Hypertension, Diabetes and Cardiovascular disease
- Awards research grants to stimulate prevention programs

CME Program (Continuing Medical Education)

Delivers clinical, hands-on training

- ISN addresses clinical needs in emerging countries by organizing Continuing Medical Education (CME) courses and site visits
- Close collaboration between:
 - the program chair, the event organizers and the ISN GO regional sub-committees
- The CME program sponsors the attendance of expert nephrologists who share their knowledge

The CMEs educate approximately 15,000 physicians per year

Educational Ambassadors Program

Provides 'hands-on' training to centers in developing countries

- Centers in the developing world can request an expert to join them onsite
 - for specific training or
 - to initiate and develop community based research and screening programs
- ISN matches the request against a database of qualified and approved experts in the field of required training
- ISN supports the available Educational Ambassador to deliver high quality and relevant training for a period of 1 to 4 weeks




